- 2) Preamble
Preamble is included at the beginning of the act. It defines the objective of the act.
- 3) Headings
Headings are allotted to a group of sections. It harmonises and defines the act.

It explains the meaning and purpose of the provisions to eliminate any doubt that may arise.
- 5) Exceptions
These are included to exempt certain conditions that may otherwise fall within the scope of the section.

Illustrations are internal aids included in order to explain the provision in detail and help provide a better understanding.
- 8) Punctuation
Symbols such as full stop, comma, hyphen etc are added side in presentation and building the meaning of the sections and etc.




