  4. The "Group of Companies Doctrine" vs Party Autonomy under Arbitration Laws: Evolution, Practice, and Sanctity
  5. Domestic Violence and Gender-Neutral Laws; A social gimmick or need.
  6. The operation of section 304B only up to seven years: The legal rationale and legislative intent. (A study on effectiveness to curb dowry death).

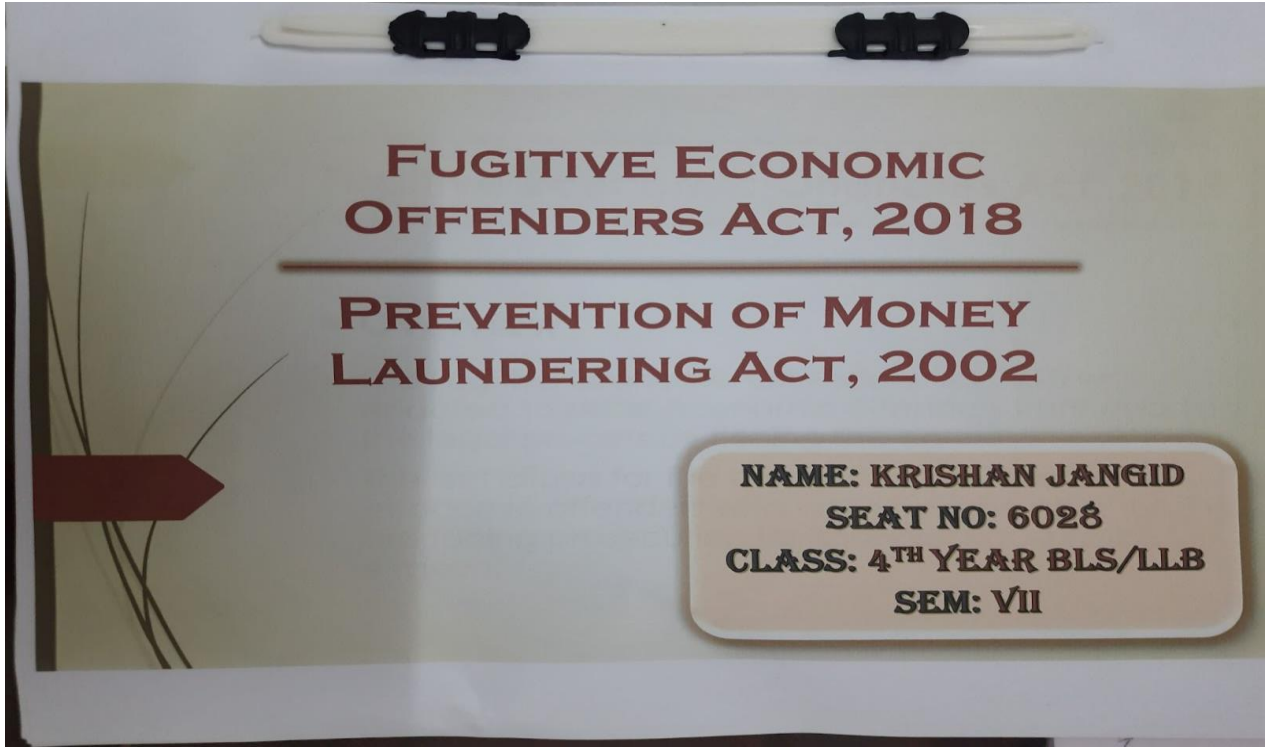
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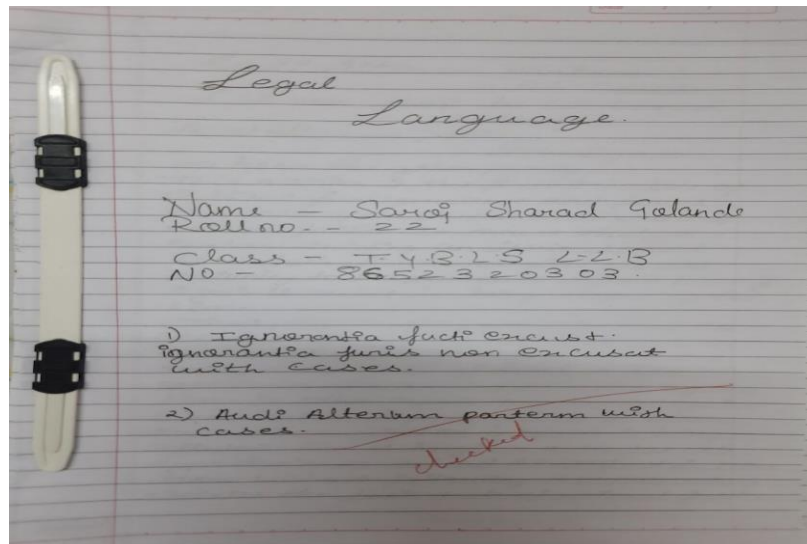
